# Scope of the Symposium

The 10th ISSP International Symposium on Nanoscience at Surfaces is the tenth in a series of international symposia organized by the Institute for

Solid State Physics (ISSP), the University of Tokyo. The symposium has been held every two or three years since 1989.

The 10<sup>th</sup> ISSP symposium will focus on physical and chemical properties of nanostructures on surfaces and their fabrication processes. Research activities in this field have been significantly growing and taking advantages of accumulated knowledge of surface science. It is highly desirable that active researchers report new achievement, exchange novel ideas and discuss directions of new researcher during this symposium.

The subjects to be discussed in this symposium are the followings.

- 1) Nanostructure formation
- 2) Structures and electronic states
- 3) Electronic transport and magnetic properties
- 4) Chemical reaction and dynamics
- 5) Nanometer-scale oxide and molecular layers
- 6) New developments in theory and experiment

#### **Call for Papers**

Because of the limited number of oral presenters, we offer poster presentation for most of the contributed papers. All the presenters should submit an abstract no later than June 15, 2006. The detailed information on submission of abstracts is now available on issp-10 web.

#### Proceedings

The Proceedings of the symposium will be published as a special issue of Surface Science (Elsevier Science). Only original and unpublished work will be considered for publication. The maximum length is 10 journal pages for invited papers, and 6 journal pages for contributed papers. All papers will be refereed and the decision for publication will be noticed later on. The manuscripts must be prepared in PDF format, and be uploaded to the submission page of the symposium website. The detail of the submission will be announced on the webpage. The dead line for receipt of the manuscripts is September 11, 2006.

#### Registration

All participants are requested to register on the ISSP-10 website. Please access to the registration page, which will open in July.

Registration Fee prior to September 1, 2006 : 20,000 yen Registration Fee after September 1, 2006 : 25,000 yen Participation of students is encouraged with a reduced registration fee of 10,000 yen.

The registration fee covers the get-together party, coffee breaks, a copy of program, a copy of abstract booklet, banquet and the proceedings. The fee for the students covers all the above except the proceedings.

#### Payment

All payment should be made in Japanese Yen. Payment can be submitted using a credit card through the internet operated by Toptour Corporation, which has been appointed as the official agent to handle all related arrangements. A bank transfer is also available. No cheques or money orders are available. Please start the payment transaction from the ISSP-10 website. An acknowledgement will be sent to you upon completion of registration with a full payment.

The cancellation should be made by writing to the symposium office. The registration fee for those who have made cancellation by September 20, 2006 will be refunded except for a charge for the transaction.

#### Social program

A get-together party is scheduled in the evening on October 9 for all registered participants of the symposium and accompanying persons. A conference dinner will be organized on October 11.

### Accommodation

Rooms at the hotels in downtown Kashiwa can be arranged for foreign visitors. The cost of the rooms is in the range between 6,000 and 12,000 yen per night per person without breakfast. Those who want to reserve rooms at the hotels should contact the symposium office by September 1, 2006. Japanese participants are kindly asked to reserve their rooms by themselves.

# Travel

Kashiwa is about 30 km north-east from Tokyo. A direct airport bus service from Tokyo international airport (Narita) to Kashiwa station is available. The detailed information is available on issp-10 web site.

# Climate
